TIMEOUT FOR A COACH'S CHALLENGE... DID MICHIGAN DODGE, DUCK, DIP, DIVE AND DODGE THE #4 BRONCOS FOR PAIRWISE RANKING GAIN?

One of the hot topics over the holidays was the Michigan Wolverines' decision on December 27th to cancel their game against in-state rival, Western Michigan, just three days before the game was to be played. Originally scheduled to be part of the 50+ year old Great Lakes Invitational Tournament, this year's games were arranged as the "Great Lakes Showcase" with a non-tournament format consisting of two pairs of games played at Michigan / Michigan State with Western Michigan / Michigan Tech swapping venues each night.

Many coaches and fans initially assumed the cancellation was Covid related, as Michigan's press release cited "health and welfare protocols within the Wolverines' program." However red flags started going up all over

the college hockey community and on social media when the Wolverines' game against #18 Michigan Tech, one day *before* the cancelled game vs WMU, remained on Michigan's schedule. Was Michigan channeling Patches O'Houlihan and dodging the #4 ranked Broncos because Michigan had five of their top players off campus playing at the World Juniors tournament, and wanted to avoid a PairWise Rankings drop?



Numerous NCAA D-I head coaches, the NCHC leadership and of course Broncos faithful everywhere were furious with the decision. The GLI and World Juniors were both scheduled well in advance. Michigan with its talent packed roster, must have expected that some players would be invited to the World Juniors. To throw gasoline on an already blazing inferno, Michigan faced Michigan Tech short only the one NCAA allowed extra skater. Michigan's line-up featured their #1 goalie, six NHL drafted players and the teams skated to a 0-0 tie.

Head Coach Pearson went on record claiming he had no part in the decision but said he supported it due to the hardship caused by playing games on back-to-back nights with a reduced roster. Ironically, nearly all of





Michigan's schedule, and most Western D-I teams for that matter, is composed of two games on back-to-back nights. At the very least, the decision reflected poorly on hockey's mentality of "next man up" and will certainly draw scrutiny and discussion among coaches and administrators during in the upcoming off-season meetings. It remains to be seen how many will give a "thumbs up" or "thumbs down" to Michigan when, if ever, more details about the late cancellation emerge.

Late in 2021, the Michigan Tech Huskies announced the release of a new 300+ page book written by noted hockey historian William J. Sproule and Michigan Tech's Assistant Athletic Director of Media Relations, Calvin Larson, covering the first century of Huskies hockey in the Copper Country. In addition to dozens of stories covering the team's roots, its three NCAA National Championships and numerous other conference and tournament championships it contains hundreds of pages of historical highlights and vintage photos of the Huskies.





While the front cover features an overhead view of the Huskies in a pre-game huddle, the back cover features a small slice of our Huskies game worn jersey collection. Now with more than three dozen unique styles worn from the mid-1960s to present day, there is always room for one more. Who is going to finally help us acquire one of the Huskies 2017 military
