TIMEOUT FOR COACHING... HOW TO AUTHENTICATE COLLEGE GAME WORN

A couple issues back, I discussed tagging that can be found in some college jerseys. With most teams not tagging their jerseys and even fewer teams issuing LoAs, how can you be certain it is a real gamer? First, college jerseys are (relatively speaking) still very hard to get in authentic “on-ice / pro weight” styles. So, if you have a jersey that is better quality than something sold at the campus bookstore, you’re off to a good start. Second, if you are buying the jersey in person having it in hand is a great way to examine game wear. The more jerseys you see, you’ll start to gain confidence in the materials and lettering styles used by certain teams/manufacturers, what typical game wear looks like and even how certain teams make repairs. Unlike the NHL, college jerseys tend to show pretty good wear by the time teams let them go. During my 25+ years in the college game worn hobby, I’ve handled thousands of college game worn jerseys. So, if you ever have a question if something looks right, feel free to view our website’s archive section or just drop me a note via email or chat via Facebook messenger with some images. Lastly, we now live in a digital era which makes game photos much easier to locate than the 35mm film era when collectors were largely limited to programs, yearbooks, and newspapers. Now nearly everyone at a game is capturing images and many of them end up “on the line” or within social media feeds. All these images make great potential sources for the rarely disputed “photo match” of your favorite jersey. Here is an example from Michigan Tech. In these

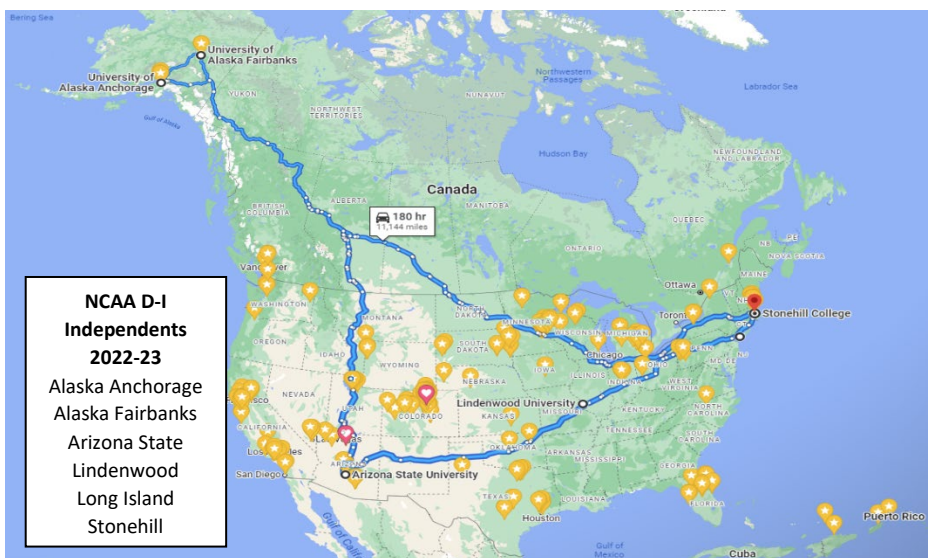
images, the lack of a repair to the slice on the front of the jersey lets the black breezers show through, making it easier to identify the slice in the game image.

As the 2022-23 NCAA D-I season kicked off, teams without a conference have never been more prevalent. Six teams took the ice this year with entire slates of non-conference games. If you wanted to take a road trip as the ultimate “indy” hockey fan, plan for about 180 hours in the car. You’ll be covering roughly 11,000 miles. Wait a year and you can include a short side trip to see Augustana in Southeast South Dakota. Ironically, Augustana, although not playing this year, already has a conference home in the CCHA

next season. If you believe the Internet hype, another half-dozen schools (or more) in the Northeast are seeing what it would take to elevate their hockey programs to Division I. What will happen with all the others? Will they find conference homes soon? Regardless, all these teams are going to be logging a lot of frequent traveler miles in the future.
